



FOUR CACHET/COVER SERIES IDENTIFIED FOR FORMER FRENCH COLONIES' 1962 MALARIA ISSUES

Illustrated above are three cachets used on first day covers for all the former French colonies in Africa which issued a common design (far right cachet) for the 1962 WHO anti-malaria campaign. The fourth common series used the middle cachet with first day cancel of the African nation issue on April 7, 1962 plus first day cancel of the Republic of China (Tiawan) issues. A common cancel design was used by the 15 African nations (see top of page).


# PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The controversy which has recently occured in our journal over the status of Clara Maas as a "malaria personality" is a healthy one. Dialogue such as this should be encouraged. To add "fule to the fire", I propose that the recent stamps commemorating the centenary of discovery of the tubercle bacillus (TB) by Dr. Robert Koch be a phase of our area of concern. At present, stamps have been announced from Algeria, Belgium, Mozambique, Turkey, Uganda, Wallis and Futuna and other nations.

Although Robert Koch made important contributions to early understanding of malaria epidemiology at the turn of the century, including attempted infection of anthropoid apes with human malarial parasites, his most important contributuion was the initiation of mass quinine prophylaxis. Based upon his experiences in the former German colonies in Africa and New Guinea, Dr. Koch advocated careful treatment of all patients, expecially children, with quinine as a method of malaria control.

Later work by others indicated that "quinization" could only produce a partial reduction in the incidence of malaria and that vector control was an important component in the control of this disease. However, through his overall influence on tropical medicine Koch did much to influence the course of malariology during the early 20th century.

I would like to extend my thanks to our authors who have devoted considerable effort to prepare original articles for the journal. They have produced much of interest and I am extremely pleased to see how willing they are to share their knowledge.




NAGALAND ISSUES (WHO MALARIA CAMPAIGN OVERPRINT) RAISE QUESTIONS



#### MALARIA CASE LOAD IN TEXAS CREATES CALL FOR IMPROVED REPORTING

The Texas Department of Health issued a call in February, 1982, for better reporting methods in cases of malaria. Seventy-three cases were reported in Texas for 1981, however, the Department is unable in every case to say where the sickness originated.

Based on the reports received, the Department surmised that most malaria cases were contracted outside the United States through travel, foreign students, visitors, and refugees. Surveillance forms from private physicians and medical facilities have confirmed this belief. But the forms sent are frequently imcomplete and sometimes are not sent, as requested.

The main concern is that in not knowing where the malaria cases originate, it could be possible for malaria foci to be established within Texas. This would present a significant public health problem, state Department officials. Due to these factors, the Department has called for all physicians and medical facilities diagnosing malaria to report cases to local or state health authorities with detailed surveillance forms.

IF YOU EXHIBIT OR JUST QUESTION HOW THOSE AWARDS ARE GIVEN - READ THIS





APS AFFILIATES COLUMN NOTES MPI AND JOURNAL - ASKS "WHATS IN A NAME"

Robert de Viloini, Chairman of the APS Affiliates Coordination Committee and author of the affiliates column appearing in The American Philatelist, gives the MPI journal a nice review and notes where interested members of APS can write for more information on MPI, in the April issue. 












# MALARIA METERED MAIL - EXAMPLES FOUND FROM 1962 THROUGH 1982

The meters with antimalaria slogans on official World Health Organization envelopes dated April 7, 1962, first day of slogan usage, are still relatively easy to locate. These were issued at Brazzaville, Republic of the Congo; Copenhagen, Denmark; Alexandria, Egypt; New Delhi, India; Manila, The Republic of the Philippines; Geneva (United Nations), Switzerland; New York, NY; and Washington, DC. All the above meters, with the exception of Geneva were illustrated in Miasma Philatelist Sales Supplement, Jan.-March, 1981, pages 4 and 5. It may be assumed that these slogans were in use for some time after their issuance on April 7, 1962. (The Terins "United Nations Specialized Catalog", 1st edition, notes that the New York meter slogan was ussed at United Nations headquarters until December 31, 1962.) Through the courtesy of Donald J. Pletsch, I have seen a meter tape from Washington, DC, dated June 13, 1962. A commercial cover from Geneva in my collection is dated December 10, 1962.

INTERPEX 1962, the International Stamp Show held in New York, NY, from March 30 thru April 1, 1062, produced many items of interest. Among these were a series of three covers sponsored by the Postal Slogan Cancel and Meter Society. They issued blue cacheted covers with suitable indicia (see illustration) and meters dated March 30, March 31, and April 1, 1062. A T-N meter no. 601179 was used with an INTERPEX-1962 slogan portraying a diagramitic antimalaria stamp and Interpex emblem.

In addition to the above meters which can be considered primarily of philatelic usage (aside from relatively scarce commercial covers), are meters which have been issued by scientific, educational and governmental agencies. The ones cited below are only those which I have encountered; others obviously exist.

- 1 London, Great Britian. For many years, the Royal Society of Tropical Medicine and Hygene used a reproduction of their seal illustrating a female Anopheles gambiae, a spray of the cichona plant and their motto: ZONAE TORRIDAE TUTAMEN as a portion of their meter cancel. Recent (1982) mailings from the Society no longer use this slogan.
- 2 Delhi, India. The Indian Society for Malaria and Other Communicable Diseases has recently (1981) used a meter with "I.S.M.C.D." as a portion of the city imprint for meter no. 2445 (see illustration).
- 3 Delhi, India. The Malaria Research Centre of the Indian Council of Medical Research has been using a meter with "M.R.C." as a portion of the city imprint (meter no. 3299). Early usage was just with the city imprint while later impressions had a MALARIA RESEARCH CENTRE slogan. This slogan appears in two versions, the earlier dated one (22 IX 81) isenclosed in a rectangle while the later (1982) one lacks the rectangle (see illustrations).
- 4 Basel, Switzerland. The Swiss Tropical Institute used an interesting slogan in 1981 recommending malaria prophylasix for tropical travelers: TROPENREISE/ MALARIA - PROPHYLAXE. The slogan is set against a tropical scene with palms.

GAO OFFERS ADVISORY REPORT TO AID ON U.S. ROLE IN MALARIA CONTROL IN DEVELOPING AREAS

A fifty-page report by the U.S. General Accounting Office to the Administrator, Agency for International Development was issued in April, 1982. This report will be of interest to many philatelic malariologists -- it is titled: "Malaria Control in Developing Countries: -- Where Does it Stand? -- What is The U.S. Role?"

The report (#ID-82-27) can be ordered from the GAO, Washington, DC 20548. It cites the facts that malaria is still a major public-health problem in many developing nations and makes recommendations for more effective use of U.S. assistance. Since the early 1950's, the United States has contributed nearly \$1 billion to combat malaria. GAO recommends that AID re-examine all existing program guidelines due to changes since they were formulated. Major changes noted that impact the need for this re-analysis include: the resurgence of malaria; emphasis on general health services to counter the threat; and a decline in U.S. financial and technical support.

The article reported that the Center for Disease Control in Atlanta has documented malaria in a 17-year old American youth who went to Kenya as an exchange student, despite taking the anti-malaria drug chloroquine phosphate.



Also available are copies of the White House letter from then President, John F. Kennedy, on the WHO philatelic campaign and the United States' participation -- again, with both US and UN issues and the INTERPEX station cancel.


An INTERPEX cachet cover (illustrated) is also available with US and UN issues and the INTERPEX station cancel, plus being available with the UN issues processed at the UN for the three days of INTERPEX (March 30-1, April 1, 1962).

"Postcards" with the WHO globe emblem and "MALARIA" exploding below are also found with a wide variety of stamp and cancel combinations. Possibly this qualifies as another Maximum card? (See illustration of an INTERPEX station cancel on combined US-UN issues.)


Most limited in availability is the banquet menu with show cancel -- only 500 were produced to match with the seating capacity of the banquet hall.

The American Philatelic Society also made special cashet covers for INTERPEX using a tip-on (label) and having the US issue with INTERPEX station cancel.








### MALARIA RESULTS FROM BLOOD TRANSFUSION

A recent New York Times article reported that a baby born at a Boston hospital developed malaria. The physicians involved suspected it was caused by a transfusion of blood infected with malaria. After diagnosis the baby was treated for a form of the disease that "is not life-threatening, if appropriately treated," according to the assistant director of the hospital's blood bank. The child is now home and suffering no apparent complications. Malaria was not found in any of the donors who were all contacted and none had traveled recently in any malaria-infested areas. The doctors involved assumed the parasites were present but dormant in one of the donors. The report did not indicate what action was taken to confirm or deny the assumption.













