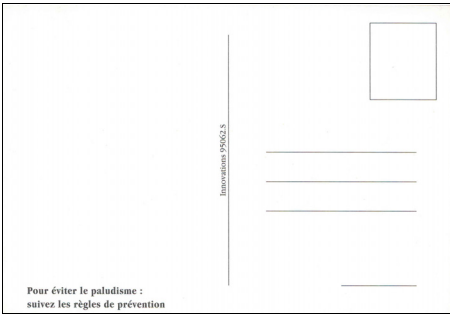


MILITARY POSTCARDS

FRANCE • 1996

In 1996 at the request of Dr. J. M. Milleliri, the French Army Health Service produced 8 cards for distribution to troops embarking for Africa, especially Chad, to remind them of the dangers of malaria and how to avoid them. Two designs of the 1916 issues for the Army of the Orient were reproduced, and 6 new designs were created. Printed on cardstock with a glossy surface, the cards measure 151 x 106 mm. The reverse of the reproduced cards is significantly different from that of the 1916 originals.



Notes: text at lower left reads To avoid malaria, follow the rules of prevention; text at center reads INNOVATIONS 95062.S, which is the designation of the military order that created the cards

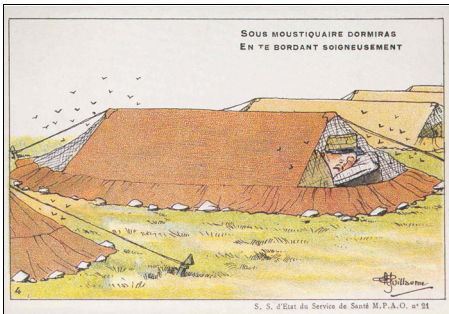

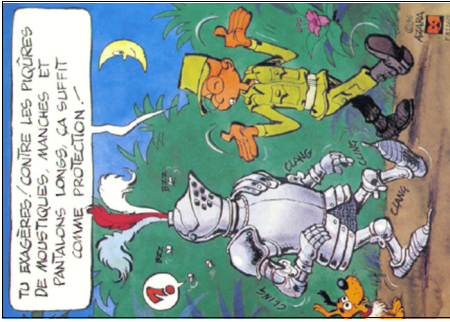
