The World Health Organization in Africa
 The World Health Organization (WHO) is an intergovernmental agency working in the health field. It has its own governing bodies and independent resources. Its Constitution was drawn up "in conformity with the Charter of the United Nations" by an international health conference in New York in 1946. By April 7, 1948, it had been ratified by 28 UN Member States, the number needed for it to come into force. WHO's relations with the United Nations are regulated by an agreement. Membership is open to all States. Members of the United Nations may join by accepting the WHO Constitution. Other countries

may be admitted to membership by decision of the World Health Assembly, the supreme governing body of the Organization. Territories which are not responsible for their international relations may be admitted as Associate Members. In 1968 126 countries were Members of WHO and three were Associate Members. Faithful to the principles of international co-operation, WHO maintains regular and close relations with all bodies concerned with public health progress.

The African Region
 The region comprises the whole of Africa south of the Sahara as well as Madagascar and a number of islands in the Atlantic and Indian Oceans with a total population of around 1,95 million.

In 1968 thirty five countries were Members or Associate Members of the Region. The Regional Organization is composed of the Regional Committee and the Regional Office. The Regional Office for Africa is in Brazzaville, Republic of the Congo. At its head is the Regional Director appointed by the WHO Executive Board in agreement with the Regional Committee. He is assisted by about 30 specialists in various health fields and the necessary administrative and secretarial staff. The Regional Office is responsible for planning and executing WHO's work in the region in each of WHO's Member States contribute its share to the Organization's regular budget. Contributions are

calculated according to the United Nations scale of assessment which takes population, national income and other factors into account. Thus all countries, great and small, rich and poor, join forces in the World Health Organization, in Africa and all over the world, to promote one of mankind's fundamental rights - the right to the highest attainable standard of health.

Inspired by this ideal, the World Health Organization remains and must remain a focal point for the hopes that the peoples of Africa place in the efforts that are being made to free them from disease. It is indeed a symbol of hope for all men and women of goodwill.

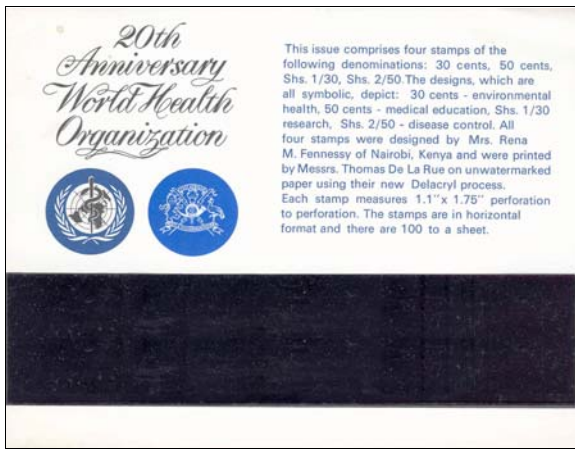



